TIPS FOR PRINTING & USE:

If possible, print on card stock and laminate or cover with clear contact paper for durability.

Ideas for use:

1. Using peanut cards, count out the number shown, laying one peanut at a time on a square number card. Compare amounts, such as 8 versus 4 peanuts ("more," "less," "about the same," "many more than," "twice as many"...)
2. Using peanut cards, count out the numbers shown, laying one peanut at a time on top both numbers of a rectangular "adding on one" card.
3. Use REAL peanuts to count and add on one!
4. Put square number cards in order from zero to nine, or use them as simple number recognition ("say the number") flashcards.
5. Make 2 copies of square number cards, place face-down on a table, and play a memory ("concentration") style matching game.
